CITESA



The current progress of Bioluminis[®] in Cuba was preceded by mutual arrangements between the Bioluminis[®] Laboratory from Valencia, Spain and different Cuban institutions. CITESA-Habana 2002 was the scenery where the first such arrangements were made, thus marking the beginning of our bilateral relationships.

CITESA-Habana 2002 was a meeting organized and sponsored by the Ministry of Public Health from the Republic of Cuba that included the II symposium “Science and Technological Innovation for Cuban Health” and the II Meeting for the Negotiation of Funding for Health-related Research. It was held at the City of Havana from October, 16th to October, 18th 2002 at the National Hotel, and the following agreements were reached on that occasion:

1. A signed collaboration agreement for starting the “Biophotontherapy in Natural and Traditional Medicine” Project between the Bioluminis[®] Laboratory in Spain, and the ISCM-H, at the “Science and Technology for Health” Meeting (CITESA-Habana 2002).
2. A Letter of Intention was signed for the process of inscription and registration of the Bioluminis[®] filters en Cuba, between the Bioluminis[®] Laboratory in Spain and the State Center for the Control of Medical Equipment (CCEEM), at the “Science and Technology for Health” Meeting (CITESA-Habana 2002).
3. A collaboration agreement was signed to carry out the “Bioenergetic Medical Aesthetics and Quality of Life” Project, with the goal of turning the Bioenergetic and Natural Plastic Surgery Clinic into an educational reference institution. This agreement was signed by the Bioluminis[®] Laboratory from Spain and the ISCM-H, at the “Science and Technology for Health” meeting (CITESA-Habana 2002).

Another of the necessary steps for the introduction of Bioluminis[®] in Cuba was to sign the reference terms for the “Biophotontherapy in Natural and Traditional Medicine” and “Bioenergetic Medical Aesthetics and Quality of Life” projects, by the Bioluminis[®] Laboratory, the Ministry for Investments and Economic Collaboration (MINVEC) and the Ministry of Public Health (MINSAP), under assessment from the Donations and Projects Unit from MINSAP. This agreement had the goal of facilitating the execution of both projects within the framework of Cuban Law and other legal dispositions regarding international collaboration.
